JOB DESCRIPTION COURT PSYCHOLOGIST

- I. STATEMENT: The Clinical Services Department provides a resource potential for accurate assessment, diagnosis and treatment plan for children in need of psychological services.
- II. QUALIFICATIONS: Must be a licensed clinical or forensic psychologist.
- III. RESPONSIBILITIES:
 - A. Administer Competency Evaluations
 - 1. Be familiar with competency evaluation requirements, as indicated by juvenile law and the Judge's specific requirements.
 - 2. Interview families and children
 - 3. Obtain and review collateral information
 - 4. Prepare final report
 - 5. Review findings with Probation Officer and any other needed personnel.
 - 6. Distribute Report as determined appropriate
 - 7. Testify in court, if needed, on any case for which a report has been completed.
 - B. Administer Assessments for Bindover/Amenability Consideration
 - 1. Be familiar with Bindover and Amenability requirements, as indicated by juvenile law and the Judge's specific requirements.
 - 2. Interview families and children
 - 3. Obtain and review collateral information

4. Prepare final report
5. Review findings with Probation Officer and any other needed personnel.
6. Distribute Report as determined appropriate
7. Testify in court, if needed, on any case for which a report has been completed.

C. Administer Psychological Evaluations

1. Be familiar with psychological evaluation requirements, as indicated by juvenile law and the Judge's specific requirements.
2. Interview families and children
3. Obtain and review collateral information
4. Prepare final report
5. Review findings with Probation Officer and any other needed personnel.
6. Distribute Report as determined appropriate
7. Testify in court, if needed, on any case for which a report has been completed.

D. Provide Supervision to Master's level psychology assistant

1. Meet regularly per APA standards to provide clinical supervision
2. Review and provide feedback on drafts of reports completed on the psychological evaluations conducted by the psychology assistant
3. Approve final reports, as deemed appropriate
